"These are the very Scriptures that testify about me."

### John 5:39

"You search the Scriptures because you think they give you eternal life. But the Scriptures point to me! Yet you refuse to come to me to receive this life."

## John 5:39-40 NLT

"Then Jesus took them through the writings of Moses and all the prophets, explaining from all the Scriptures the things concerning himself."

### **Luke 24:27 NLT**

- Week 2, October 20: Jesus from the line of David.

# TAVISTOCK HILL Walking Club



We have introduced a Hill Walking Club, which meets on the second Saturday of each month. Details of the walk's time and location will be provided in advance, with the possibility of arranging extra walks based on interest. Our first walk was a 6-mile route, taking around 3 hours. For those interested, optional map and compass training is also available.

Walkers should be prepared for rough moorland with appropriate gear: waterproof boots, good quality waterproofs (jacket and trousers), warm layers, food, water, and a personal first aid kit. Please be aware that the only way off the moor is by walking, so be sure you're up for the challenge. No dogs are allowed for now, but this may change in the future, following National Park guidelines.

This club is open to everyone, including those outside the church, and is intended purely as a walking group, though conversations of all kinds are welcome. Walks will take place in most weather conditions unless it's deemed a safety risk. If the walk needs to be cancelled, a notice will be posted on <a href="https://hillwalkers.org.uk/">https://hillwalkers.org.uk/</a>, along with a kit list for future walks.
